

GREAT NEWS FOR OUR IRTA MEMBERS

On Tuesday, May 19, 2020, the Appropriations Bill was introduced, and it has full funding for the TRIP/TRAIL program and pensions.

Both are funded at the certified amounts provided by TRS.

The General Assembly adjourned early Sunday, May 24

SENATE BILL 264 was passed and is now being sent to the Governor. This is the budget bill and it is fully funding TRIP/TRAIL and TRS.

SENATE BILL 1857 was also passed and is headed to the Governor's desk. This bill will allow retirees to continue to work 120 days for the 20-21 school year.

How It All Began - Origin of Post-it Notes

In 1968, Dr. Spencer Silver, a scientist at 3M in the United States, was attempting to develop a super-strong adhesive. Instead, he accidentally created a "low-tack",

reusable, pressure-sensitive adhesive. For five years, Silver promoted his "solution without a problem" within 3M, both informally and through seminars, but failed to gain acceptance. In 1974, a colleague, Art Fry, who had attended one of his seminars, came up with the idea of using the adhesive to anchor his bookmark in his hymn book. Fry then utilized 3M's officially sanctioned "permitted bootlegging" policy to develop the idea. The original notes' yellow color was chosen by accident, as the lab next door to the Post-It team had only yellow scrap paper to use.

TRS "BUYOUT" PROGRAMS EXCEED EXPECTATIONS

Interest in the state's two pension "buyout" programs has proved to be so strong that officials must increase the amount of money appropriated to



meet all lump-sum payments. In all, participating TRS members have requested \$269 million in buyout funds, which is \$56 million more than what state government originally had allocated to TRS for the programs.

The Governor's Office of Management and Budget is planning to allocate additional money to TRS - enough for the remaining payments in fiscal year 2020 and for anticipated payments in FY 2021, which begins in July.

At the end of the first year of "buyouts," newly retiring TRS members participating in the "Accelerated Automatic Increase" program shared approximately \$90 million. In all, 17.4% of retiring members decided to participate.

Inactive members in the "Accelerated Pension Benefit" program shared \$180 million. The participation rate in this program was 10.4% of all eligible inactive members.



124,700 RETIREE BENEFITS PAID ON TIME

All TRS member benefits for May were paid in full and on schedule despite coronavirus restrictions. Working from home, TRS staff processed and certified payments for 124,700 retired members and beneficiaries and sent the

payment requests to the Illinois Comptroller's Office. The Comptroller's Office then transferred the funds on time to the bank accounts of all eligible members.

> The benefits paid using "work from home" procedures totaled \$589.6 million in May 2020.

How TIMES HAVE CHANGED: More than 60 years ago, CBS aired "Lucy is Enceinte," the



Season 2 episode of "I Love Lucy" in which Lucy (Lucille Ball) and Ricky (Desi Arnaz) find out they're going to have a baby. The episode, which aired on December 8, 1952, made Lucy TV's first pregnant character, but the script did not use the word "pregnant" once. "Lucy Is Enceinte" was scandalous at the time, at least in the eyes of the CBS executives who balked at the idea of its star — who slept in a twin bed next to her husband onscreen — actually acknowledging and openly displaying the biological consequences of S-E-X. The script famously had to dance around saying the word 'pregnant,' a term

CBS deemed too vulgar for air, hence the French word for pregnancy in the episode title.







Normal People by Sally Rooney

Normal People is a story that explores the subtleties of class, the electricity of first love. and the complex entanglements of family and friendship. At school Connell and Marianne pretend not to know each other. He's popular and well-adjusted, star of the school soccer team while she is lonely, proud, and intensely private. But when Connell comes to pick his mother up from her housekeeping job at Marianne's house, a strange and indelible connection grows between the two teenagers one they are determined to conceal. Throughout their college years they circle one another, straying toward other people and possibilities but always irresistibly drawn back together. Then, as she veers into selfdestruction and he begins to search for meaning elsewhere, each must confront how far they are willing to go to save the other.

Dreamland: The True Tale of America's Opiate Epidemic by Sam Quinones



Dreamland is a scathing and incendiary account of drug culture and addiction spreading to every part of the American landscape. Sam Quinones weaves together two classic tales of American capitalism: The stories of young men in Mexico, independent of the drug cartels, in search of their own American Dream via the fast and enormous profits of trafficking cheap black-tar heroin to America's rural and suburban addicts: and that of Purdue Pharma in Stamford, Connecticut, determined to corner the market on pain with its new and expensive miracle drug, Oxycontin; extremely addictive in its own right. Quinones illuminates just how these two stories fit together as cause and effect: hooked on costly Oxycontin, American addicts were lured to much cheaper black tar heroin and its powerful and dangerous long-lasting high.

You can't possibly make a difference!" At this, the young man bent down, picked up yet another starfish, and threw it into the ocean. As it met the water, he said, "It Made A Difference to That One."

ILLINOIS RECORD UNEMPLOYMENT RECORD RATES

Lowest: 3.4% in November 2019 Highest: Over 17% in May 2020

The unemployment rate in Illinois reached a staggering 16.4% in April 2020, the highest rate recorded since the modern system of tracking joblessness began in 1976. The previous record of 13.9% was set in February 1983.

The numbers reflect an overall loss of 762,200 nonfarm jobs since March, the largest single-month decline in state history, and a decline of 822,800 jobs since April 2019.


