CONSTITUTIONAL ISSUES CONCERNING HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS

On February 16, 2017, IRTA presented the following issues to our law firm Tabet, DiVito & Rothstein LLC. The issues presented regarding retired educators were:

- Are the health insurance benefits received by retired Illinois educators protected by the Pension Protection Clause (Art. XIII, § 5) of the Illinois Constitution? Teachers'
- If so, what is the scope of that constitutional protection?

OUR LAW FIRM RENDERED THE FOLLOWING EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Retired Illinois educators' health insurance benefits are protected by the Pension Protection Clause for the reasons set forth in Kanerva v.

Weems, 2014 IL 115811. The Pension Protection Clause prohibits the General Assembly from amending the State Employees Group Insurance Act, 5 ILCS 375/1, et seg., so as to reduce the State's subsidy for retired educators' health insurance benefits or push health insurance costs onto retired educators.

IRTA LEGAL DEFENSE FUND

CURRENTLY \$ 100,000+

IRTA's Legal Defense Fund money is used solely for legal expenses incurred defending our pension benefits. The last time IRTA went to court, our lawyer fees were almost \$1.2 million! Thankfully, another organization joined us in our court battle and shared that expense. However, this may not be the situation when we go to court next time, especially if the case involves just retired educators health insurance benefits. All retired educators need to be aware of legislative actions and plan to equally participate and share the cost.

Some Successful Lobbying IRTA Has Done for YOU Over the Decades:

1981 Health insurance and prescription drug insurance plan instituted.

1982 Survivor's benefit increased to 50% of deceased spouse's current pension and death benefit set to \$3,000.

1989 Compounded 3% annual increase (based on Current pensions) for annuitants and survivors – state instructed to increase contributions to the state-funded pension systems in order to amortize unfunded liabilities, with interest, over a 40-year period.

IRTA VoterVoice efforts helped prevent the General Assembly from passing legislation that would have allowed the State of Illinois to issue IOU's to TRS for its 2011 pension payments.

IRTA was the ONLY opposition to a bill that attempted to force TRS annuitants to choose between their health insurance and their compounded 3% Cost of Living Allowance (COLA) – the IRTA made it clear the association would sue the state if the measure became law.

IRTA filed a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of Public Act 98-0599 – Court injunction issued May 14 delayed implementation.

The Illinois Supreme Court ruled unanimously that the 2013 state law overhauling Teachers' Retirement System benefits was unconstitutional – final chapter in the 15-month-long legal challenge.

2017 IRTA worked at stopping another unconstitutional measure aimed at diminishing benefits for retired teachers. The Illinois Senate passed a bill restoring funding for the Teachers Retirement Insurance Program (T.R.I.P.), after trying in the first attempt to eliminate it.

ILLINOIS' OVERDUE BILLS



A major bond rating agency stated that the state should go ahead with a proposal to borrow money that would be used to pay down the bill backlog. S&P Global Ratings said it is likely the state can borrow money at a lower interest rate than it is now paying on overdue bills.

On most of the state's overdue bills, the late interest fee comes to 12% a year. The state runs up \$2 million a day in interest charges on its overdue bills.

"The state may realize net fiscal savings which we believe Illinois can ill-afford to pass up given its weakened financial position, even if the additional debt ... adds incrementally to its operating deficit," S&P said. S&P said the borrowing, and subsequent reduction in overdue bills, would give the state back some measure of flexibility in dealing with its finances. It said the borrowing is unlikely to improve the state's credit rating, but it could provide some additional protection against a further downgrade.



The budget approved by lawmakers in July authorizes up to \$6 billion in borrowing to pay down old bills. S&P said the spending plan assumes a \$360 million surplus that could be used to finance about \$3 billion in borrowing.
