## TRS COMMITS \$360 MILLION TO INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Teachers' Retirement System has committed more than $\$ 360$ million to various investment opportunities; all designed to advance the mission of TRS on behalf of its 412,000 members. During a regularly scheduled meeting of the TRS Board of Trustees, the System's investment staff reported the following actions:

Extended $\$ 100$ million from the System's $\$ 10$ billion Global Fixed Income portfolio to the Pacific Investment Management Corporation of Newport Beach, California for the firm's Distressed Senior Credit Opportunities Fund II. PIMCO currently administers $\$ 2.9$ billion in System assets.

Committed $\$ 100$ million from the System's $\$ 6.6$ billion Private Equity portfolio to EQT Funds Management of Stockholm, Sweden. EQT currently administers $\$ 155.9$ million in TRS assets.

Within the $\$ 10.8$ billion International Equity portfolio, terminated the small capitalization strategy of Mondrian Investment Partners, of London, England, which had totaled \$324 million in TRS assets. Mondrian still administers $\$ 782.6$ million in System assets in a large capitalization strategy. Following this action, $\$ 260$ million in TRS assets were transferred to Strategic Global Advisors, of Newport Beach, California and $\$ 64$ million was retained in cash by TRS. SGA currently administers $\$ 683.1$ million in TRS assets.

## IRS Frauds Top the Senate Committee List of Senior Scams

A new 2017 report by the U.S. Senate Special Committee on Aging states that the most common scams target older adults. Scams in which fraudsters pretend to be employees of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are the most common complaint seniors reported to the fraud hotline in 2017, according to a report released this week at a hearing.
"In IRS scams, criminals impersonate IRS staff and demand payment for back taxes," Sen. Susan Collins (R-Maine), committee chair, explained at the hearing. "These scammers are absolutely ruthless when it comes to swindling seniors out of their money.

According to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration, between 2013 and 2017, scammers impersonating IRS officials have targeted more than 2.1 million taxpayers, and more than 12,000 victims report losing more than $\$ 60$ million from this type of scam alone.

The committee's studies estimate that senior citizens lose $\$ 3$ billion each year in savings. "Our sacred responsibility is to take action so not one more senior loses one more penny."

If you suspect you've been the victim of fraud, you can report it to AARP's fraud hotline at (800)222-4444.
Volunteers can refer you to the appropriate agency for filing a complaint.
