TEACHERS RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF ILLINOIS (TRS) FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2019

Member Contribution \$964 million School Districts
\$88.5 million

State Contribution \$4,500 million

Total Contributions \$5,552.5 million

Benefit Payout \$6,800 million

Investment Return 5.2% \$2,600 million

Without a positive investment return of at least 3% TRS would have had a negative cash flow for FY 2019.

Fund Balance at the end of FY 2019 \$53.3 billion (40.5% funded) Total Liability \$131.5 billion (\$78.2 billion unfunded)

Using the state spending plan that started in 1995 and since amended, TRS called for and expects to receive \$5.1 billion in FY 2021 from the state of Illinois with 75% of that representing the state's partial contribution of what they owe TRS for past underpayments.

TRS ACCELERATED PAYMENT PLANS UPDATE

TRS must offer all retiring Tier 1 members an accelerated pension benefit payment equal to a portion of their future pension benefits. In order to receive the AAI payment, the participating member must accept an irrevocable reduction in the automatic annual increase that will apply to the remainder of his/her TRS pension. Only retiring Tier 1 members are eligible



for this voluntary program. The decision to participate in the program is irreversible and final. The AAI Program will exist until June 30, 2024. Members who choose to accept the program will:


Renounce their rights to the current Tier 1 annual increase – a 3% compounded raise in their current pension. Accept a new annual increase that begins at age 67 – an annual 1.5% raise in their pensions not-compounded.

Receive a lump-sum payment that equals 70% of the monetary difference between the estimated current lifetime value of the 3% annual raise and the estimated current lifetime value of the 1.5% annual raise.

- Current number of Tier 1 retirement applications in 2019: 3,687
- Members choosing to participate in the AAI program: 592
- Current total to be paid out to participating members: \$72.4 million
- Current average payment: \$137,000



CORRUPTION COSTS ILLINOIS TAXPAYERS AT LEAST \$550M PER YEAR

Illinois is the third-most corrupt state in the nation, according to a recent report by the University of Illinois at Chicago. Corruption comes with social and economic costs. Not only does corruption lessen residents' faith in the government, it decreases economic growth and disincentivizes investments in the state.

CORRUPTION

Illinois' public corruption convictions cost the state economy an estimated \$550 million every year from 2000-2017, the Illinois Policy Institute estimated according to a 2011 study published in the peerreviewed academic journal "Public Choice." That's a total during those 17 years of more than \$9.9 billion.

Federal corruption convictions per capita were 8% more common in Illinois than in other states during that time period. The annual loss of economic activity means the 285,000 Illinoisans actively seeking employment find it harder to land a job, and the state economy will likely continue to lag the rest of the nation.


