Roger also offered assistance to anyone with insurance questions. There were no committee reports.


President Wheeler asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Peggy Shane moved to adjourn the meeting and Mike Olson seconded the motion.

Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes

Terry Knapp was invited to the PARTA Board Meeting to provide some background information on legal support



During those years, Peoria Public Schools was a partner with the Edison Learning Company. In essence, I had two bosses. That was the genuine excitement of it all, and it was those years that brought leadership challenges and rewards. In 2011, I bid adieu to Peoria Public Schools with much gratitude.
