
#### **PARTA Scholarship Committee**

#### FRED KLONSKY ON ILLINOIS RETIREMENT HEALTH INSURANCE

"It was not until the Illinois Retired Teachers Association announced it was going to court did most of us who are retired Illinois Teachers become aware that the state was reducing its funding to the teacher retirement health insurance system (TRIP/TRAIL). Central Management Services (CMS), an agency of the executive branch, requested a \$45 million reduction in funding and the Teacher Retirement System board approved the reduction, with only the two elected retired members voting NO.


The IRTA said it had its actuarial experts look at the funding and said it spelled trouble for sustaining the retiree benefit for more than four years.

To me this smells like a diminishment of our pension benefit and the Illinois Supreme Court said the state can't do that."


