
### PEORIA AREA RETIRED TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT'S CHRISTMAS GREETING

# **PARTA MEETING MINUTES**

The PARTA meeting for November convened at the Cater Inn on November 6, 2023. Dixie Wheeler, the President, presided over the meeting, at which

Carolyn Faulkner, and Beth Thomas **MEMBERS** were the new members. President Wheeler thanked the meeting greeters, Rhonda Kokos and Deloris Turner. The Pledge and Invocation were led by the President.

The members were reminded the treasurer's report was on the table, and there was a book table and a battery recycling box. Special recognition was given to Cater Inn for its continued hospitality. President Wheeler introduced the program guest, Greater Peoria Honor Flight, with Gene Wallace, Aline Wallace, and Bob Reed. The Honor Flight Program is open to all veterans. Veterans are encouraged to sign up for the program. Special consideration is given to veterans with extreme

medical challenges. The Honor Flight Program is in 44 of the 50 states. The membership was educated on the Greater Peoria Honor Flight activities,

from the flight's takeoff at General Wayne A. Downing Airport to visiting all the various war monuments in Washington, D.C., to its landing at General Wayne A. Downing Airport. What does leaving a coin on a military headstone mean? A coin left on a military headstone lets the deceased soldier's family know somebody stopped by to pay respect. If you left a penny, it means you visited. A nickel means you and the deceased soldier trained at boot camp together. If you served with the soldier, you left a dime. A quarter is very significant because it means that you were there when the soldier was killed.

• Life membership will increase from \$2.50 to \$3.50 (monthly dues deduction) and an increase from \$400-\$600, lump sum.

• All active state members will be allowed to vote for officers **INCLUSIVE** and all issues relative to IRTA.

• Members will have the ability to vote electronically or by paper ballot.

• The Nominating Committee will now be the Leadership Development Committee.

• The Finance and Leadership Committees will have a representative from each region.

• Each Unit is allowed to have a representative on the Legislative Committee. The reduction of the size of the thirty-three-member IRTA Board was not approved. Roger will address the IRTA dues increase in the December *Soundings.* 

Unit of Distinction - PARTA has been recognized as a Unit of Distinction for two consecutive years. President Wheeler charged members to start tabulating their volunteer hours, which is a contributing

factor in maintaining a Unit of Distinction status. IRTA Cruise - President



Wheeler reported that the IRTA cruise was enjoyable. She was able to connect with IRTA members within the state and out of the state. It was a great time of camaraderie. President Wheeler asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Roger Hampton moved that the meeting adjourn. Peggy Shane seconded the motion.

# IRTA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The 2024 application and current guidelines for the IRTA Foundation Scholarships will be available December 1, 2023. Applications and current

guidelines will be posted on the IRTA website at: www.irtaonline.org/foundation/scholarships.

One \$2,000 scholarship is available in each of the six IRTA Areas of the state. These scholarships are only available to incoming juniors or seniors in college enrolled in a certified teacher training program. The deadline to postmark or email applications is March 7, 2024.

Other scholarships available in 2024 are the Moler-Austin Scholarship which offers two \$4,500 scholarships to Kendal County High School graduates that will be entering their Sophomore, Junior, or Senior year of college with a declared major in Education. The Helen Kennedy Scholarship is a \$2,000 scholarship and is available to graduates of any Illinois High School that will be entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year of college with a declared major in Education. Finally, the Rose Sandstrom Scholarship is for \$2,000 and is available to one incoming senior in college attending either Western Illinois University or Monmouth College with a declared major in Physical Education.

# LEGISLATIVE VETO SESSION

Legislators convened in Springfield at the beginning of November for the veto session and acted on several major initiatives – and left without addressing some others. A list of these initiatives can be found on the "Members Only" portion of the IRTA website. Both chambers adjourned until January 16, 2024, and released calendars for the 2024 Spring Session.

The controversial *Invest in Kids Scholarship Program* will expire on December 31, 2023. This is a scholarship program where low-income kids are sent to private schools using taxdeductible donations to a charity. About 9,500 kids are taking part in the program this year.




