

**AUGUST 28, 2023** 

The PARTA Board Meeting was conducted at Lakeview Library on August 28, 2023, at 10:15 AM. Members present were Dixie Wheeler, Valda Shipp, Deloris Turner, Jeff Vallosio, Dave Barnwell, Jeannie Blane, Roger Hampton, Abby Humbles, Peggy Shane, and Sally Weber.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

**TREASURER:** Jeff Vallosio reported no money transfer from investments last year but anticipates transferring approximately \$3,000 this year.

FINANCE: During the recent meeting, Dave Barnwell praised Trent Strong, PARTA's Financial Advisor at Legacy Investment Services, INC., for his commendable financial advice to the organization. Barnwell recommended that Trent brief the members on the investments during the October meeting, allocating about 15 minutes on the agenda.

**ATTENDANCE/RESERVATIONS:** The year's schedule has been finalized and planned accordingly.

**GREETERS/INVOCATION:** There was no report to provide as the list has been completed.

LEGISLATION: According to President Wheeler, there have been few developments regarding IRTA. MEMBERSHIP: According to Roger Hampton, over fifty PARTA life members need contact information. - Convention/Constitution: Roger mentioned that one of the convention's noteworthy proposals would be allowing all IRTA members the right to vote.
   President Wheeler requested to adjourn the meeting. Abby Humbles made the motion, and Sally Weber seconded it.

## TOTAL RETIREE ADVANTAGE ILLINOIS (TRAIL)

The TRAIL Medicare Advantage Prescription Drug (MAPD)
Program Open Enrollment runs from October 15 - November 15,
2023. No changes can be made prior to October 15, 2023.

Beginning October 15, 2023, you can go to MyBenefits.illinois.gov to learn more about your new plan. Live TRAIL seminars will be available to provide additional information and answer questions you may have. No action is required, unless you have a change, or you wish to opt-out of the plan. More information will be sent by mail.

INITIAL ENROLLMENT (IE) is offered to all Medicare-eligible retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents within 60-days of the 65<sup>th</sup> birthday (of the youngest enrollee). Initial enrollment is a one-time offer.

OPEN ENROLLMENT (OE) is an annual enrollment period held in the fall of each year. This enrollment period is open for Medicare-eligible retirees, survivors, and their dependents to change their elections, or for anyone who previously waived or canceled coverage to re-enroll.

## YOUNG MAN MAKES WRONG TURN, THEN SAVES SLEEPING FAMILY FROM FIRE

A driver who took a wrong turn was able to save the lives of four people after miraculously driving down their street and seeing their house on fire. A doorbell camera video captures the moment the young man from Omaha, Nebraska, ran around the house to start banging on windows, and calling 911. Brendan Birt told KETV News 7 that the fire was getting worse every second, but he wasn't giving up. "I just felt like somebody was in there because it was so late at night, you know? I just knew that I had to act quick."



On the video, three kids are eventually seen running out through the door in the Red Oak, lowa neighborhood—and finally their 22-year-old brother, who was looking after his younger siblings, emerged. When he saw the kids come out the door, Birt said, "I just felt like I wanted to break down and cry (and) I don't even know these people."

The boy's mother, Tender Lehman, was in Montana at the time dealing with a family emergency.

Mrs. Lehman described Birt, who is a singer/musician, as "family", now, and called it a miracle. "They're safe—and they're safe because of him," she told KETV.

#### SMS PHISHING ATTEMPT AT ANOTHER STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM



Teachers Retirement System of Illinois was recently made aware of an SMS phishing attempt at another retirement system within the State of Illinois. Phishing and spam texts are fraudulent attempts to get personal information from you.

They typically ask you to click a link. Clicking the link may take you to a website

asking you to provide credentials or personal information.

In an attempt to share information with our members and annuitants, TRS is posting this information to let you know that TRS would never ask or request information through a text message. TRS will not share



any personal information through text with any entity. If you receive text messages of this type, which appear to be from TRS, please let them know by emailing them and provide any relevant information.

## FALL VS AUTUMN VS HARVEST

#### WHY IS IT CALLED FALL?

Recorded use of the word fall as the name of the third season of the year comes from as early as the 1500s. The name is thought to originate in the phrase the fall of the leaf, in reference to the time of year when deciduous trees shed their leaves. The name of its inverse season, spring, is thought to come from the phrase spring of the leaf—the time when everything is blossoming. The name fall was commonly used in England until about the end of the 1600s, when it was ousted by autumn.

#### WHEN IS IT CALLED AUTUMN?

The word autumn comes from the French autompne, from the Latin autumnus, whose deeper roots are obscure. It's first recorded in English as early as the late 1300s—notably, both **Chaucer and Shakespeare** used it in their works. Today, speakers of American English commonly use both fall and autumn to refer to the season. though fall became more common in the US by the late 1800s. Speakers of British English largely use autumn or the autumn season.

#### THEN WHEN IS HARVEST?

The earliest known name for the season in English is harvest. It comes from the Old English word hærfest, of Germanic origin, perhaps with an underlying, ancient sense of "picking, plucking" (as in, picking fruits to harvest them). Eventually, the use of harvest as a name for the season fell out of use, instead becoming used for the period when ripened crops are harvested gathered for processing and winter storage. The word harvest can also refer collectively to those ripened, gathered crops themselves.
